Most common mistakes (Cargill & O'Connor, 2009)

Incorrect use of

- **Prepositions**
Composed by, in contrast to, consistent with, equivalent to
- **Part of speech**
Drought resistance varieties
- **Articles**
In the animals, in inner cortex, bacteria are released into cell cytosol
- **Modal verbs**
In the second study under glass house conditions we could find a significant difference between the two seed types
- **Singular/plural**
Each of the samples were treated with the same dose of antibiotics
- **Over complex/inaccurate grammatical structures**
This may be due to lower pH hinders dissolution of soil organic matter and decreases total Cu concentration
- **Tense**
Since the start of the dotcom era a great deal of research is conducted

Subject-verb agreement

- Understanding of these concepts **has/have** been difficult
- The introduction and conclusion of the thesis **has/have** been corrected
- The analysis of the results **reveal/s** a significant difference between the groups.
The participants who enter the study **receive/s** questionnaires.
- The percentage of correct responses as well as the speed of the responses significantly **increase/s** with practice.
- A small number of male participants **was/were** included
- The small number of responses **was/were** surprising
- A total of 1000 responses **was/were** required
- Half of the participants **was/were** allocated to the control condition
- Every infant, toddler and child **is/are** tested
- One in four participants **has/have** a score of ..

Parallel constructs

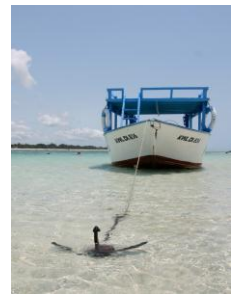

Acknowledging the need for further research

Reinforce the contribution of your own research and acknowledge the need for further research in the area

This research has made important contributions to X and Y but there is scope for future work in this area.

The development of a more general X that applies to networks other than Y and Z remains an enormous challenge.

Paragraphing

- Clear topic sentence that reflects the whole paragraph
- One point per paragraph
- Make sure the paragraphs fit together i.e flow



During the past decade bullying has received growing attention in organization research. Researchers have reported alarming findings about the negative consequences associated with bullying, both for the individuals and the organizations concerned. As for the effects on the organization, bullying has been shown to be associated with higher turnover and intent to leave the organization, higher absenteeism, and decreased commitment and productivity (Hoel et al., 2003; Keashly & Jagatic, 2003). In addition, for the victim bullying has been reported to result in both lower levels of job satisfaction, psychosomatic symptoms and physical illness, and possible expulsion from the labour market (Hoel & Cooper, 2000; Keashly & Jagatic, 2003; Leymann, 1996; Vartia, 2001). Thus, bullying is very costly for both organizations and society as a whole (cf. Leymann, 1992a). What is more, although substantive task conflict has been shown to increase performance under certain circumstances, affective relationship conflict, which bullying usually is, does not have such positive effects (Jehn, 1995). - Our experimental results demonstrate that space-and propagule-limitation both regulate *S.muticum* recruitment. Our finding that *S.muticum* recruitment was positively related to propagule input is similar to those of two previous studies (Parker 2001; Thompsen *et al.* 2006), in which the propagule input of invasive plants was manipulated. Is your writing flabby?

- Subjects (characters) are short and specific and have clearly identifiable verb
 - Use of abstract nouns derived from verbs or adjectives (nominalisation) makes writing **hard work**

 - **Evaluation** **Examination**
 - An evaluation of our outcomes is necessary if we are to see an improvement in our service

Is your writing flabby?

- **The plate inhibition assay has several limitations.** The different fungal species have different growth rates on the PDA media used in this study. As long as dothistromin is not degraded, slow growing species are more likely to be exposed to a higher concentration of dothistromin as it accumulates in time. The results might be different on other media with optimal growth conditions for the competitor species. However, growth conditions in nature are usually sub-optimal and *S. septosporum* grows sub-optimally on PDA media (Ganley 2001). **Another limitation** of this assay is that the inhibition of growth of the competitors caused by the *D. septosporum* dot* has only been investigated in one environmental condition.
